

Maths Revision – Autumn examinations.

Form 8

CE candidates will sit two papers – Non-Calculator and a Calculator paper. These will be full or close to full C.E. papers. There are three levels of paper - 1, 2 or 3. Pupils will sit a paper relevant to their own level. The ISEB revision guide has information on which topics are sat at each level. In class the pupils are given lots of practice sitting these papers.

Scholarship candidates will sit appropriate scholarship papers and will have had practice working through these papers before the examination.

Form 7

In year 7 the examination is made up of two papers. One paper is mainly on material covered in the Autumn Term and has some questions that need a calculator. The second paper is more general and tests work that has been also covered in year 6 – this is a non-calculator paper. Revision is done in class for these examinations and the pupils are encouraged to take these revision sheets home if they need extra time revising.

Form 6

In year 6 the examination is one non-calculator paper. This paper tests work that has been covered in the Autumn Term. Revision is done in class and sheets can be taken home if needed.
