'OUTSTANDING' CARGILFIELD IS 'SECTOR LEADING'

A team of five inspectors from Education Scotland visited Cargilfield and published their report at the start of this academic year. During their five-day visit, the inspectors explored all aspects of the School's provision and engaged with staff, parents, governors and children. Their resulting report notes that, "the School's motto 'Where Learning is an Everyday Adventure' is evident in the exciting and motivating experiences for children". They described Cargilfield as "sector leading" and awarded us an outstanding report in all four inspection categories.

"I am extremely proud of our achievements as it reflects the quality that I see on a day to day basis at Cargilfield: the high quality learning in which I see your children engaged; the passionate teaching and pastoral care that I see delivered by my colleagues in and out of classrooms; and the committed support to the whole community from governors and other members of staff."

HAVING A BALL

The grand finale of our 150th Celebrations was the 150th Anniversary Ball on Saturday 1st June. The committee worked tirelessly to organise an outstandingly successful event for over five hundred former pupils, parents and friends. Guests were welcomed by our pipe band whose numbers were swelled by some special guests, including parents and former pupils. An auction, expertly run by old boy Henry Beeby, raised a fantastic sum for the Cargilfield 150th Anniversary Fund which will be used for bursaries and development projects.



D-DAY LINK

A recent assembly to mark the 80th anniversary of D-Day prompted one current Cargilfield family to tell us about a fascinating link with wartime Cargilfield. During the Second World War, the school had been evacuated to Lawers House in Perthshire and the school buildings were taken over for military use. In 1944, Bea Herbert was serving in the Women's Auxiliary Air Force (WAAF). She worked at RAF Turnhouse plotting plane movements and was billeted at Cargilfield. This photo shows her (bottom left) on the Headmaster's Lawn. Before her death in 2022, aged 98, she was able to tell her great grandchildren, current pupils Timothy and Sophie Aldridge, about her very different memories of Cargilfield.



CRICKETING SUCCESS

Cargilfield is the only school in Scotland to be included in The Cricketer 2024 Top 50 School Guide. They recognise our dedication to inclusivity and fostering a love of cricket in all pupils which is especially evident in our trail-blazing girls' cricket programme. All girls over the age of 11 are given the option to play hardball cricket and mixed cricket matches are played at the U9 level. Our 1st XI Girls' team have weekly coaching sessions with Owen Gould, Captain of Scotland's Under 19 team and have relished the chance to compete in the new Under 15 Cricket Scotland School's Cup.

Many congratulations to former pupil Chris Sole on being signed by Glamorgan CCC for the Vitality Blast T20 competition. Chris has recently returned from playing for Scotland in the T20 Men's ICC Cricket World Cup held in the West Indies and USA.

The 150th Anniversary saw us host important reunion events in Edinburgh and London. Over 170 former pupils, parents and staff members as well as current staff and parents were welcomed by Cargilfield pipers to a party at Edinburgh's New Club. In London, Lord Dholakia hosted a wonderful reception for 160 former pupils, parents and friends at The House of Lords. We also enjoy hosting smaller reunions, such as the event for pupils from the 1960s organised by Mr Colin Liddell.
